**Olympic National Park and Forest Brings “Best of the Northwest” Experience

Lake Crescent Lodge Extends Season and Package Dates through Oct. 31

OLYMPIC NATIONAL PARK, WASH. – Aug. 30, 2010 – ARAMARK Parks and Destination’s “Best of the Northwest*” package, which combines lodging at [Lake Quinault Lodge](#), [Kalaloch Lodge](#), [Sol Duc Hot Springs Resort](#) and [Lake Crescent Lodge](#), is back by popular demand for the fall season. The package is available for booking Sept. 13 through Oct. 31, with the exception of Sol Duc Hot Springs Resort, which closes for the season on Oct. 23.
